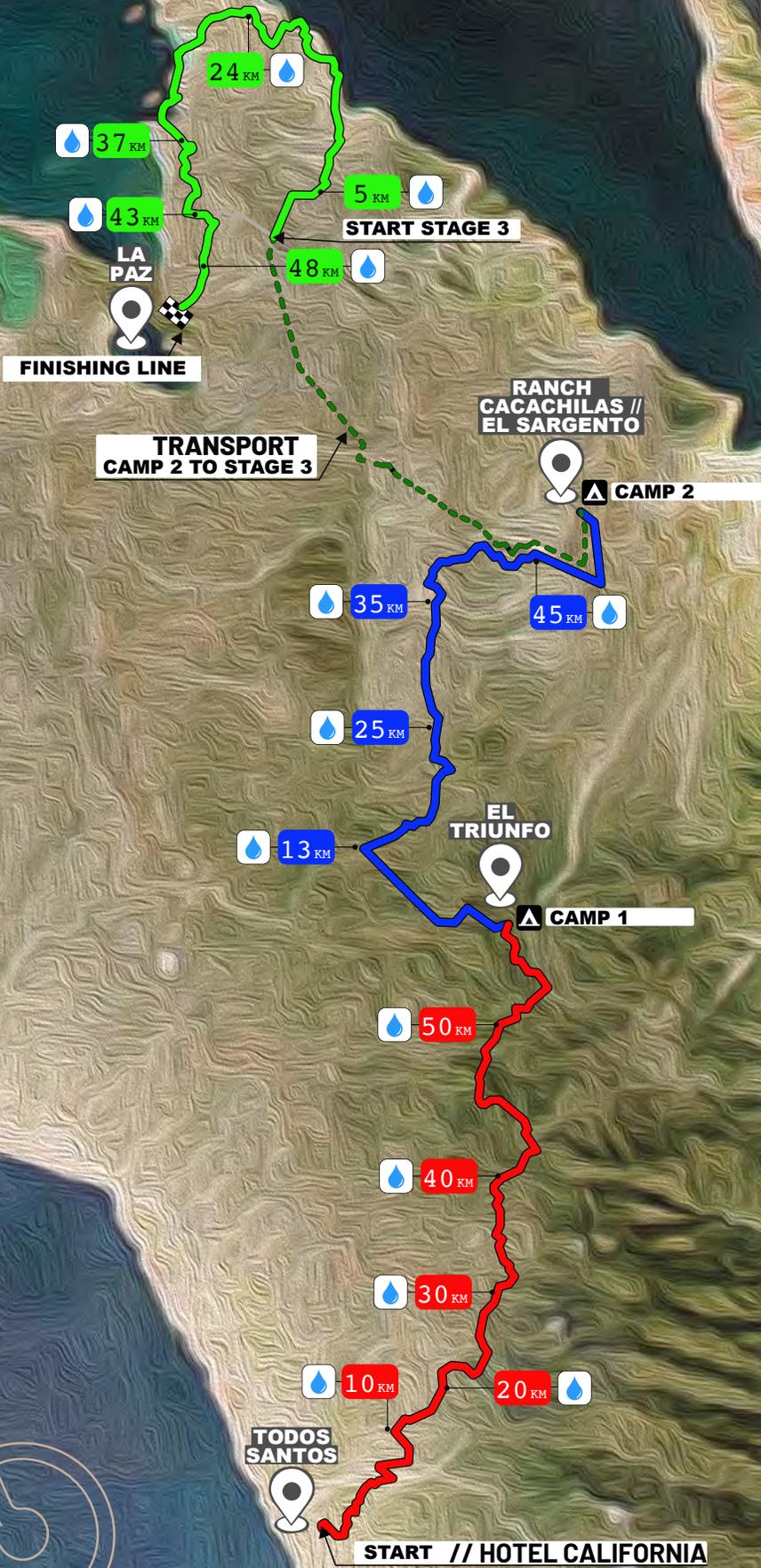

THE JOURNEY TO **TODOS SANTOS**

How to get there?



You're on the edge of a journey filled with unique landscapes, flavors, and aromas—and the destination is Todos Santos. Before you embark on this odyssey, here's a treasure map to get there smoothly.

Your starting point could be from the skies. If you're in the United States, good news! Cities like Los Angeles, Dallas, and New York connect you directly to Los Cabos International Airport (SJD) on a flight that brings you even closer to the adventure.



DEPARTING FROM
LOS CABOS

Now you are the pilot of your destination.

If you prefer to travel by highway, taking a car (your own or a rental) from the airport is a great option. You'll pass breathtaking roads and landscapes and, in about **1 hour**, you'll reach your destination.

Public transportation
If public transportation is your thing, there are also options that will get you there in no more than **1 hour and 35 minutes**.

Traveler note: On your way you'll see beaches like Secret Rock Beach and iconic places like Cerro del Chivo Piratón. Don't miss a thing!

Cost Details

Your trip can vary in cost depending on the route you take:

- Flights: between \$200 and \$800 USD.
- Car rental: from \$50 to \$150 USD.
- Public transportation: approximately \$23 USD.



Departing from La Paz

Take the reins and head to Todos Santos by car.

In about 1 hour and 15 minutes, you'll be immersed in the essence of your destination.



If you prefer, public transportation is available, with a journey of approximately **1 hour and 40 minutes**.

Cost details:

If you decide to travel from La Paz, costs vary. Flights, rental cars, and public transportation have their respective fares.

The city of Los Angeles, Phoenix, Dallas, and others connect you to Manuel Márquez de León International Airport (LAP).



From La Paz to Los Cabos

If your destination is Los Cabos, the journey takes about **2 hours and 15 minutes by car**.

If you choose the bus, the trip is around **3 hours**.

AID STATIONS



Along your route, the coast will give way to the desert as you head toward El Triunfo. Every **20 KM**, our aid stations will offer not only the recovery you need, but also a glimpse of the landscape transition.

From water to isotonic drinks, bars, and petroleum jelly: we've thought of everything for your well-being.

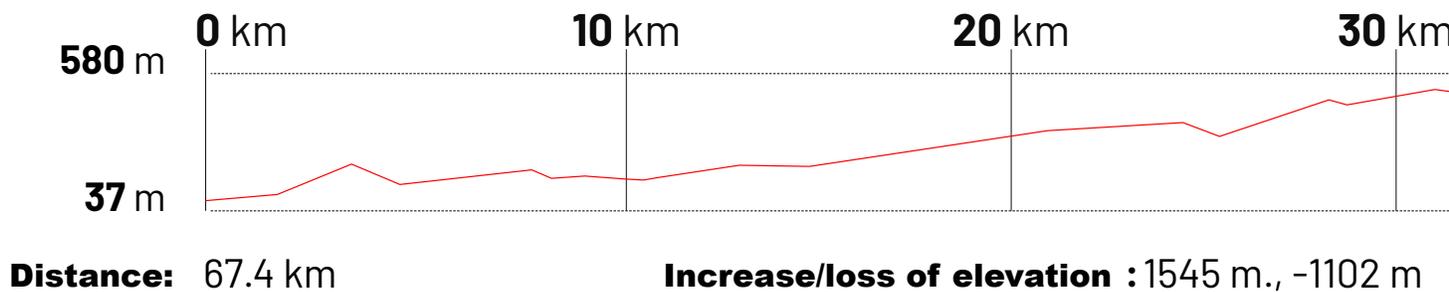
Plus, a medical team will be ready if you need it, and each station will also serve as a split-time checkpoint.

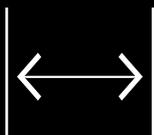

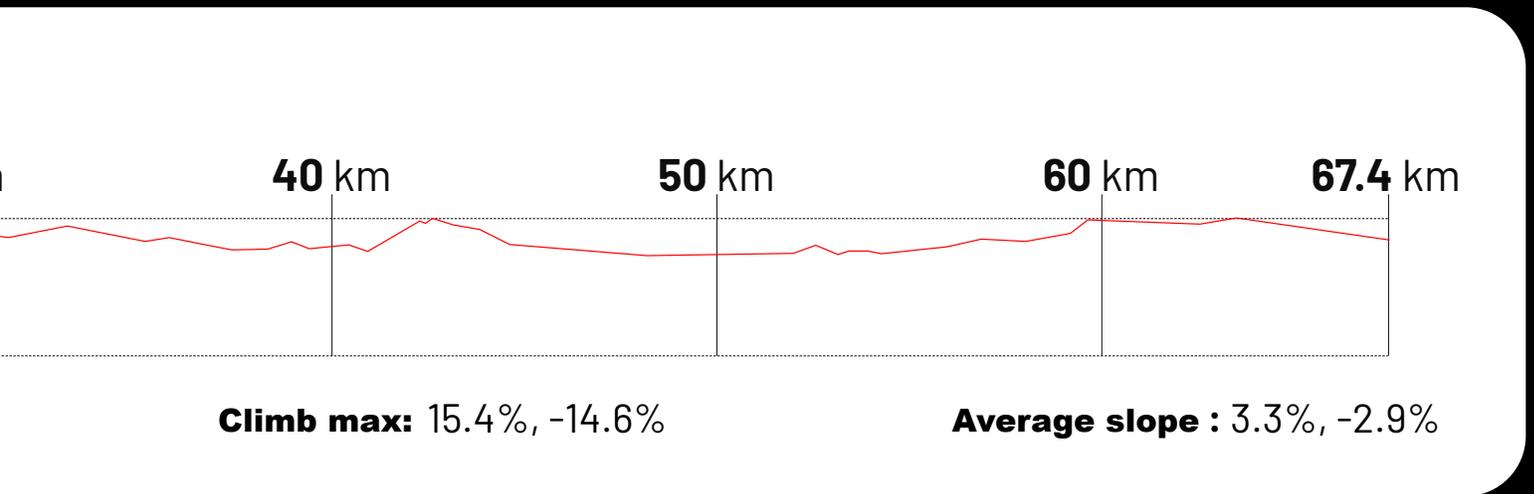

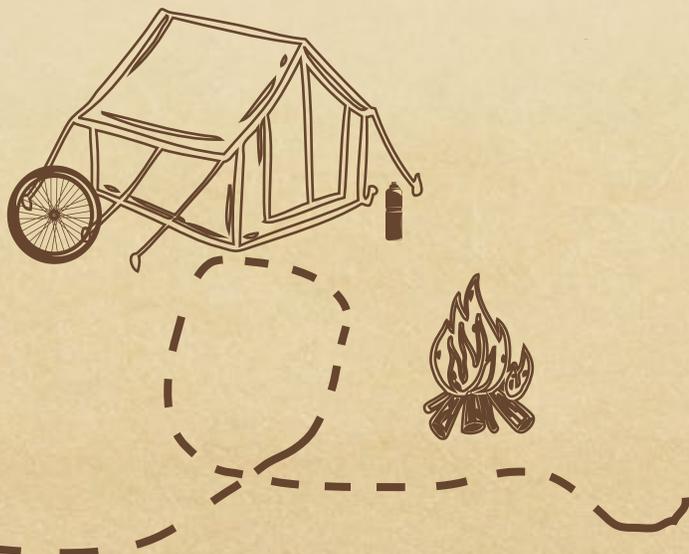

TIPS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

TESTIMONY FROM MIGUEL ÁLVAREZ, CYCLIST WITH MORE THAN 15 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE:

"From my first pedal strokes across the vastness of Baja California Sur, I knew every stage would be unique: a challenge and a revelation. The second stage, from El Triunfo to Rancho Cacachilas, is particularly special and, at the same time, demanding. Here, the desert and the sea converge, and it is precisely that contrast that takes your breath away.



MY ADVICE FOR THOSE WHO DARE TO TAKE ON THIS STAGE IS SIMPLE, BUT CRUCIAL:

1. HYDRATION IS YOUR NUMBER ONE

PRIORITY. Don't wait until you feel thirsty; by then, it's too late. Use the aid stations and refill bottles and hydration packs at every opportunity.

2. PROTECT YOUR SKIN. The Baja California Sur sun is no joke. I wear sleeves and apply sunscreen generously, especially on exposed areas. Reapply every couple of hours.

3. KNOW YOUR BODY AND LISTEN TO ITS

SIGNALS. If you feel the heat is affecting you, don't hesitate to stop for a moment in the shade and recover.

4. BE CAUTIOUS AT MAJOR CROSSINGS.

Even with excellent road support, caution is never too much—especially at km 45 before entering Rancho Cacachilas.

And above all, don't forget to enjoy the route. Despite the challenges, the views, sensations, and experiences of this journey are unmatched.

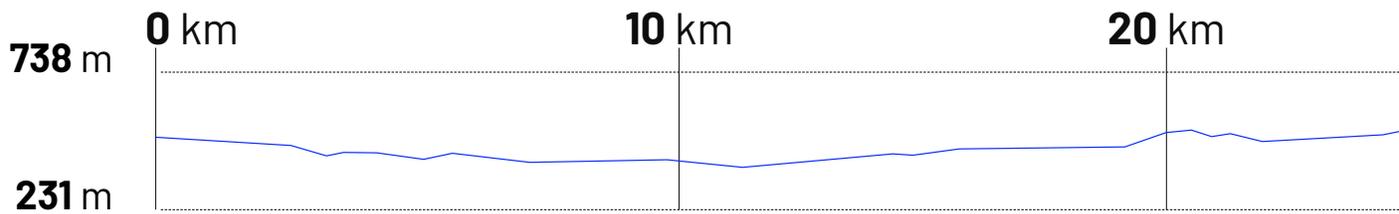

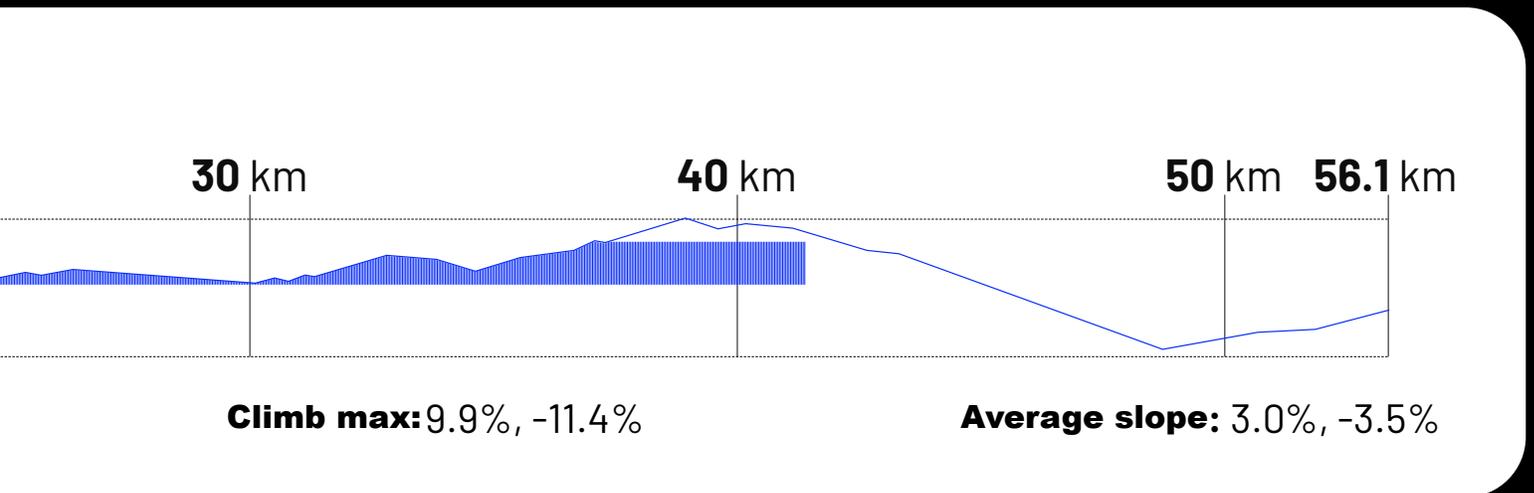

This ranch blends nature and sustainability in the middle of the desert; surrounded by mountains and panoramic views, it offers a unique experience with natural trails, endemic flora and fauna, and a stargazing observatory.

From Rancho Cacachilas, we will transfer you to the **PLAYAS DE EL SARGENTO**, where you'll find the second camp of your journey. Wake up to the sea breeze and the soothing sound of the waves. Everything is set for your comfort and rest—just like in the first camp at El Triunfo.

El Sargento's beaches offer well-earned rest and the chance to **RELAX** after your day. Starry nights and nature's song will be the perfect soundtrack for your recovery. Enjoy the coastal amenities and activities in this refuge before the finish.

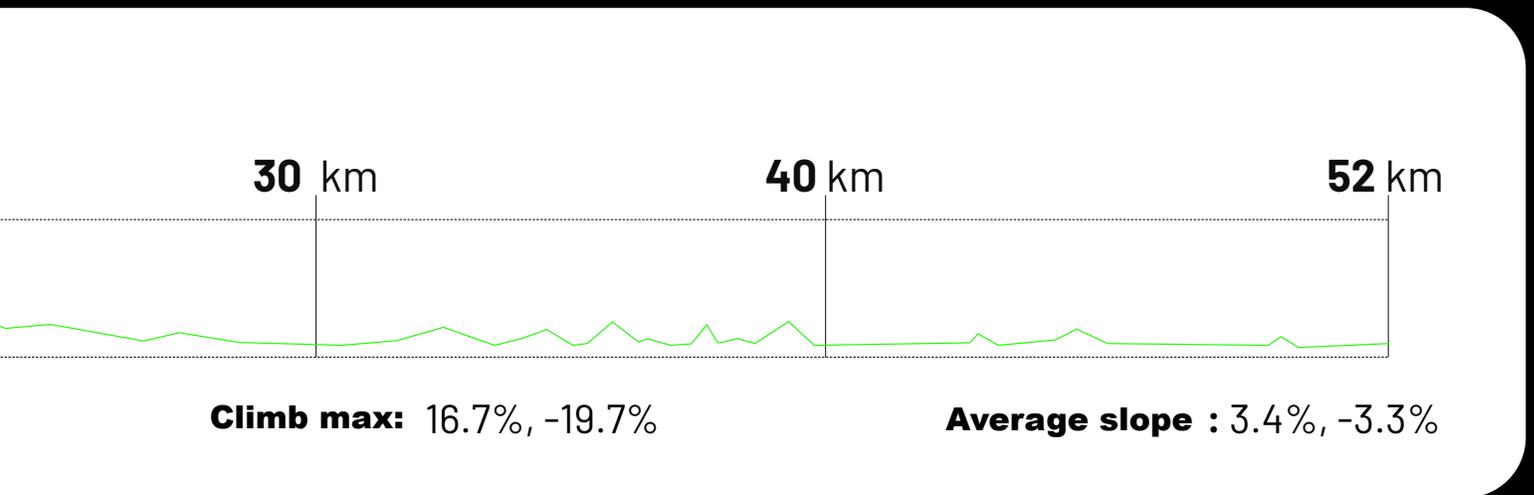

Start your day at the picturesque **CAFFE TODOS SANTOS**, located at Centenario 33, Centro. This rustic spot serves a delicious breakfast that will prepare your palate for the day.



Then, enjoy a well-deserved break at **PLAYA CACHORA**, a beautiful local beach. You can also visit "Tortugueros Las Playitas" to experience the unique turtle nesting area.
Address: Boca between Calle Los Mangos and Camino Internacional.



If you're looking for excitement, jump into the waters of Playa Cachora and explore marine life. You can also **DIVE** with experts from Tortugueros Las Playitas—the perfect way to warm up before Nomadix.



For culture lovers, **TODOS SANTOS' HISTORIC CENTER** offers galleries and photogenic corners. Don't miss the chance to visit the Mission of Nuestra Señora del Pilar, just 5 minutes from the Historic Center.

DAY 1 FLAVORS AND ADVENTURE



Treat yourself to authentic Mexican food to start the day right at La Esquina restaurant, popular with locals and visitors.

To keep exploring, discover incredible views on the Cerro Punta Lobos hiking route: about 2 hours and 7 km, starting at Punta Lobos beach.

To refuel, visit Jazamango, where they serve fresh, delicious dishes made with ingredients from their own garden.

Address: Los Naranjos s/n, Fraccionamiento

Then, walk through town and dive into galleries and traditional markets—you'll surely find something to take with you as a souvenir of your Nomadix journey.

Complete the day with a spectacular sunset at El Mirador: 10 minutes by car or a 30-minute walk from the center. Head to Restaurante El Mirador for breathtaking views. Access to the hill is free.

NOTE: To go to Punta Lobos beach and return, you'll need a car if you want to do it in 10 minutes. On foot it will take at least 1 hour.

Discover Todos Santos' rich sugar history and taste it in dishes and desserts: jamoncillos de leche, lemon sweets, chimangos, and local fruits like mango, sugarcane, or guava. A unique culinary experience.

COMMUNITY GUIDELINES

At the heart of every heroic journey lies strength of character—the kind that is tested in physical and mental challenge. At Nomadix, honor, integrity, and respect are the compass that guides participants. These principles strengthen resolve and build the legacy we leave behind. In this challenge, every pedal stroke, every climb, and every breath are testimony of commitment—to oneself, to route companions, and to the majestic land that welcomes us.

Together we transcend limits and elevate the spirit of the true nomad hero.

HONOR IN EVERY PEDAL STROKE

NOMADIX ADVENTURE OCEAN TO OCEAN RULES

1. RACE FORMAT

1.1 Participants who do not finish a stage or arrive after the established time may continue in the next stage, but their time will not be accumulated for the overall classification.

1.2 The spirit of the challenge is perseverance and endurance; however, each stage is vital for classification.

2. PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

2.1 Participants must be at least 18 years old at the time of the event.

2.2 The category in which each participant competes is determined by their age as of December 31, 2024.

2.3 For a category to be officially recognized, there must be at least 5 pairs registered. If not, categories with lower registration will be moved up to the next higher category.

3. INTEGRITY IN COMPETITION

3.1 The use of prohibited substances will result in immediate disqualification and loss of the right to continue in subsequent stages.

3.2 Deviating from the official course with the intention of gaining an advantage will result in disqualification.

4. COMPETITOR IDENTIFICATION

4.1 Numbers provided by the organization must be clearly visible on the helmet, the jersey, and the front of the bicycle.

4.2 The sticker with elevation profile and key route points must be placed in a visible spot on the bicycle. It is the cyclist's responsibility to follow the marked route.

5. CONTROLS AND TIMES

5.1 There will be control points established along the route, with cut-off times.

5.2 Arriving after the cut-off time at a control point will result in the participant being stopped and transported to camp.

5.3 Participants may load the routes onto their GPS devices. A technical support team will be available for assistance.

6. STARTS

- 6.1 The start control will open one hour before the scheduled start and close fifteen minutes before.
- 6.2 Starts will be in waves, according to modality and category.
- 6.3 Passing through the start arch is mandatory.

7. FINISH AND CLASSIFICATIONS

- 7.1 It is the athlete's responsibility to follow instructions to reach the meeting point.
- 7.2 The scoring table will be distributed as follows: to be determined.

8. AID STATIONS AND ENVIRONMENT

8.1 Hydration will be provided at the start and there will be aid stations along the route.

You can find:

- Water
- Isotonic drink
- Ice
- Energy bars
- Snacks
- Check points
- Medical service

8.2 Each participant is responsible for their waste. Littering outside designated points will result in a penalty.

9. BICYCLE SPECIFICATIONS

9.1 MTB (Mountain Bike)

- Bicycles specifically designed for mountainous terrain and trails.
- Must have at least one suspension (front or full).
- Tires may not exceed 2.5 inches in width.
- Aero bar or triathlon-style handlebars are not allowed.

9.2 e-Bike (Electric bicycles)

- Bicycles equipped with an auxiliary motor that assists pedaling.
- Only motors with a maximum power of 250 W are allowed, with no assistance above 25 km/h.
- e-bikes are not considered for competition; therefore, participants in this category will not be ranked. Their participation is recreational and for enjoyment.
- You are solely responsible for managing your battery, as well as bringing your charger.
- You will find electric supply zones where you can recharge to have a full battery. During the ride, we recommend using Eco mode until it becomes necessary to increase assistance.

THE TRAVELER'S ARSENAL

MANDATORY DAILY EQUIPMENT FOR COMPETITORS

Our heroes embark on a demanding journey, and in this odyssey, equipment is their armor. Learn the essentials every cyclist must carry daily to face the challenge of the road.

THE TRAVELER'S ARSENAL

MANDATORY DAILY EQUIPMENT FOR COMPETITORS

1. Journey machine: MTB bicycle.

2. Life support:

- Hydration backpack.
- Water bottles for hydration.
- Thermal blanket.

3. Safety guardians:

- Helmet.
- Gloves.
- Cycling shoes or suitable athletic shoes.
- Whistle.
- Headlamp.
- Rear and front lights.

4. Road preparations:

- Spare inner tubes (minimum 2 per day).
- Inflating pump.
- Basic tools (tire levers, patches, Allen keys).
- Spare patches.

5. Personal protection:

- Sunscreen.
- Petroleum jelly.
- Energy gels.

6. Navigation and time:

- GPS watch.

7. Clothing:

- Enough clothing to race for 3 days.

Additional equipment for e-bike bicycles:

- Charger compatible with the bike's battery.
- Backup battery (recommended).

A MANDATORY EQUIPMENT INSPECTION will be carried out the day before the start of the race. It is each athlete's responsibility to ensure they have the required equipment. Random checks will be conducted along the route. Those who do not comply will face a time penalty on their stage time. This regulation not only seeks fairness, but also guarantees the safety and well-being of every participant.

ABODE OF THE BRAVE

CAMP RULES

AT THE JOURNEY'S STOPS—WHERE HEROES GATHER TO RECHARGE AND PREPARE FOR THE NEXT STAGES—THE CAMP RISES AS A REFUGE. LEARN THE RULES THAT WILL GUIDE YOUR STAY.

8. CAMPS

8.1 Temporary homes: tents

- Tents will be assigned according to a map provided at the race.
- They are provided by the organization and designed to accommodate 2 people.
- In DUO mode: you will share a tent with your teammate.
- In individual mode: you will share with a participant of the same gender, assigned randomly.
- If you want an individual tent: additional cost.
- External assistance or additional equipment is not allowed in the camp area. Only items inside your camp bags may be used.

IMPORTANT: THE ORGANIZATION WILL NOT SET UP PERSONAL EQUIPMENT.

SPECIFIC RULES

- 8.1.1 Only the tents provided by the organization are allowed.
- 8.1.2 Blankets or mats may be brought if they fit in the camp bag.
- 8.1.3 Participants may bring their camp bag for transfers, with all items stored inside.
- 8.1.4 Maximum bag weight: 20 kg.
- 8.1.5 Avoid items that could damage bags.
- 8.1.6 Meals: buffet-style dining available at set times. Protein powders, bars, gels, etc. are not included.
- 8.1.7 Bathrooms and showers available. Please use considerately.
- 8.1.8 Quiet rules: no music or noise after 22:30. Respect is essential.

ON THE HERO'S PATH, harmony and respect at camp are fundamental. These rules guarantee a friendly, camaraderie-filled environment. Those who do not respect the rules will face warnings and possible penalties.

WHAT HAPPENS TO MY BELONGINGS?

BELONGINGS LOGISTICS

ON THIS EPIC JOURNEY, CAMPS ARE TEMPORARY STOPS. BUT WHAT HAPPENS TO WHAT YOU DON'T CARRY DURING THE CHALLENGE? WE'VE GOT YOU COVERED.

9. DELIVERY OF TRAVEL BAG AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS

9.1 Drop-off procedure:

- The day before the start: athletes must deliver their travel bag and personal belongings at the collection point designated by the organization.
- Identification: each bag must have a tag with name, participant number, and destination camp clearly visible.
- Weight and dimensions: the bag must not exceed 20 kg. All items must be inside; nothing should stick out.

9.2 Transport and care:

- Bags will be transported by the organization from one camp to another.
- They will be stored in a designated area and available for pickup upon arrival.
- The organization commits to caring for luggage, but is not responsible for fragile or valuable items.

9.3 Pickup:

- Upon arriving at camp, athletes must go to the designated area to pick up their bags.
- Verify you are picking up the correct bag and check your belongings.

9.4 Special considerations:

- We recommend carrying a daypack with items you need during the race. The travel bag should be for belongings not used during the stage.
- Avoid packing liquids that may spill or sharp items that can damage the bag or other athletes' belongings.



PROTECT YOURSELF: ROAD CHALLENGES

SAFETY TIPS



Nomadix Adventure Ocean to Ocean is not without natural challenges. Here are some tips to stay safe at all times:

- **Wild animals:** If you encounter an animal, stay calm, avoid sudden movements, and never try to feed it. Keep a safe distance.
- **Difficult roads:** On steep or rocky trails, reduce speed, use brakes carefully, and keep your eyes on the path ahead.
- **Hydration:** Heat and constant effort can lead to dehydration. Make sure you carry enough water and rehydrate regularly.
- **Communication:** Always inform someone of your plans and route. Even during a race, it's vital for the team to know where you are.

WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

FAQ

1. Where do you recommend I travel and what day should I arrive considering the race logistics?
It depends on each competitor's logistics. The race starts in Todos Santos, so you can arrive one day earlier to register calmly.
We recommend flying into Los Cabos and returning from the La Paz airport.
4. Can I arrive first in Los Cabos, stay in Todos Santos, and do my registration on Friday before the race?
Yes. You can fly into Los Cabos, transfer and stay in Todos Santos, and complete your registration either on Friday or one hour before the race starts.
5. If I prefer to arrive in La Paz, can I transfer from there to Todos Santos before the race begins?
Yes. You can also arrive directly in La Paz and from there take ground transportation to Todos Santos.
Approximate transport cost: \$250 MXN.
6. Does registration include meals, water, and accommodation throughout the entire race?
Yes. Registration is all-inclusive:
Accommodation, tent with mattress, warm-water showers, meals, and hydration.
7. What services are included exactly in the registration?
Registration covers: race, meals, water, bathrooms, showers, camps, mattress, blankets, and all necessary services during the event.
8. Will I have to pay any additional expense during the race outside of what organizers cover?
No. You will not have to pay absolutely anything additional to the organizers during the race.
9. Will there be aid stations/supplies along the route?
Yes. There will be aid stations distributed along the entire route.
10. What happens if during a stage I can no longer continue competing?
The entire route will be monitored by more than 50 staff members. If at any time you cannot continue, one of our vehicles will pick you up and take you to camp.
11. Will staff be monitoring competitors throughout the route?
Yes. Staff will be present and monitoring competitors at all times.
12. If I drop out of a stage, will I be disqualified or how will my time be adjusted?
You will not be disqualified. You will be assigned a time equivalent to 30 minutes more than the last competitor who finished that stage.

13. Will there be mechanical service during the race and before and after each stage?
Yes. We will have mechanical service available before and after each stage.

14. Will there be mechanical service along the entire route to support technical issues?
Yes. Mechanical service will be available throughout the route to support competitors.

15. What is the approximate temperature during the race, day and night?
During the day, temperatures are expected to be around 32°C, as we are in a desert zone. At night, temperatures drop considerably.

16. How many bags are allowed per competitor according to the rules?
One bag per competitor is allowed.

17. What is the maximum allowed weight for luggage?
The bag may have a maximum weight of 10 kg, in addition to the bike box.

18. Does the organization store the competitor's bag and the bike box?
Yes. The organization is responsible for storing both the bag and the bike box during the race.
